They replace the 8 Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), which expire at the end of 2015. Specific details of the Global Goals will be decided in March 2016.

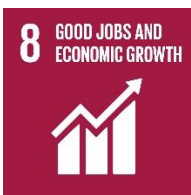
